Balancing these three layers is key to a comprehensive, long-lasting sense of well-being. A skilled practitioner will intuitively sense which layer needs attention, creating a session that is deeply personalized.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN A JIN SHIN JYUTSU SESSION

If you are new to this art, you may wonder what a session actually entails. A typical session lasts about 60 to 90 minutes. The recipient remains fully clothed and lies on a comfortable padded table, similar to a massage table but without the need to remove any clothing. The practitioner does not use oils, lotions, or forceful pressure.

The session begins with a brief conversation about what is currently happening in your life and what you would like to address. The practitioner may then gently "listen" to your energy by taking your pulse or by placing their hands lightly on your shoulders or head. This is not a diagnostic process in the medical sense, but a way to sense where the energy is stuck or depleted.

Then, the practitioner will place their hands on a series of Safety Energy Locks. They may place one hand on your head and the other on your hip, or one hand on your shoulder and the other on your foot, depending on the pattern that needs to be harmonized. The touch is extremely light—just the weight of a nickel. Often, the practitioner will hold a position for several minutes before moving to the next one. This is not a passive process; it is a dynamic, meditative interaction between the practitioner and the recipient's energy field.

During the session, people experience a wide range of sensations. You might feel a sense of deep relaxation, warmth in certain areas, a gentle pulsing or "energy moving," or even a feeling of lightness or floating. Some people fall asleep, which is perfectly fine and often a sign that the body is releasing deeply. After the session, it is common to feel calm, centered, and more grounded. Some people feel a burst of creative energy or a desire to rest. Drinking plenty of water and allowing yourself some quiet time after the session is recommended to integrate the shifts.

- **Thumb:** Held for worry. Gently wrap your fingers around your thumb and hold for one to two minutes, breathing deeply. This can help release mental tension and worry about the future.
- **Index Finger:** Held for fear. Wrap your other hand around your index finger and hold. This supports feelings of security and courage.
- **Middle Finger:** Held for anger or frustration. Holding the middle finger can help release irritability and bring a sense of calm.

- **Ring Finger:** Held for sadness or grief. This finger is associated with letting go. Holding it can help you process loss or disappointment.
- **Little Finger:** Held for "trying to be" or pretense. It relates to our tendency to act out of alignment with our true self. Holding it can help us be more genuine.

You can hold each finger for one to three minutes, or simply hold the finger that you feel drawn to when you are experiencing a particular emotion. This simple practice can be a powerful tool for self-regulation throughout the day.

The "Main Central" Flow

Another core self-help technique is to place one hand on the forehead (the "main central" point at the top of the head) and the other hand on the sternum (the center of the chest,
