basket strings later.

Step 5: Attach the Basket and Strings

Cut four equal pieces of string or yarn. Attach one end of each string to the bottom edge of the balloon envelope using tape or glue. Then, attach the other ends to the four corners of the basket template. Adjust the strings so the basket hangs level. For a more polished look, use a hole punch on both the balloon base and the basket rim, then thread

the string through and tie knots. This step requires patience, as uneven strings will cause the basket to tilt.
