9. **Vampires Are Forever** – Thomas Argeneau and Inez Urs.
10. **The Immortal Hunter** – Decker Argeneau and Dani McGill.
11. **The Rogue Hunter** – Garrett Mortimer and Samantha Willan.
12. **The Renegade Hunter** – Nicholas Argeneau and Lissianna's story (crossover).
13. **The Immortal Highlander** – Ewan Argeneau and Lady Marguerite.
14. **The Reluctant Vampire** – Drina Argeneau and Harper Thomas.
15. **The Wrong Highlander** – Graeme Argeneau and Evanna MacKenzie.
16. **The Highlander's Promise** – Aulay MacKay and Elysande.
17. **The Highlander's Time** – Raoul Argeneau and Mary.
18. **The Highland Bride's Guard** – Brodie MacKay and Teala.
19. ... and many more. The series continues with new titles released regularly.

Important note: The Argeneau series also includes novellas and short stories that fill gaps. Most can be read after the main novels, but for completists, the author's website provides a chronological list.

Argeneau Spin-Offs

Sands has expanded the Argeneau universe with at least two spin-off sub-series: the **Highland Argeneau/ MacKay series** and the **Dracula series**. These are best read after you have met the main Argeneau family, as they reference characters and events from earlier books.

- **Highland Argeneau / MacKay Series:** Begins with *The Immortal Highlander* (#13 in main series). This sub-series follows the MacKay brothers and their mates. Reading order: *The Immortal Highlander*, *The Wrong Highlander*, *The Highlander's Promise*, *The Highlander's Time*, *The Highland Bride's Guard*, *The Highlander's English Bride*, etc. These books are also part of the main Argeneau series numbering, so you can simply follow the numbers.
- **Dracula Series:** Sands wrote a trilogy about the original Dracula family, set centuries before the main Argeneau timeline. It includes *Immortal Bite* (previously *The Bite Before Christmas*?) Actually, the standalone Dracula book is *The Dracula Chronicles* but be cautious: Sands's Dracula books are not part of the standard Argeneau reading order. They can be read anytime, but they work best after you are familiar with the lore. The trilogy: *The Bite Before*

Christmas (co-authored with Alexandra Ivy? No, that's different). To avoid confusion, consult the author's official list.

HISTORICAL ROMANCES BY LYNsay SANDS

While Sands is synonymous with paranormal romance, she has penned many **historical romance novels** that do not involve vampires. These are standalone or loosely connected series set in medieval England, Scotland, and Regency-era Britain. HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR STARTING POINT

With so many books, the best **Lynsay Sands reading order** depends on your preference:

- **If you love vampires and family sagas:** Start with *A Quick Bite* and continue in publication order. You will meet recurring characters and laugh at the Argeneau family banter.

For example, the romance between Lucian Argeneau and Leigh Byrne in *Bite Me If You Can* is a pivotal moment. Skip that book and later references will confuse you. Therefore, stick to the numerical order for the main series.

For spin-off novellas, you can find collected editions such as *Bite Before Christmas* (contains two holiday novellas). These should be read after you are familiar with the core couples involved.

Many readers use the author's official website (LynsaySands.net) for a **Lynsay Sands reading order** list. The site updates with each new release and includes a calendar.
