## Leigh as Hedra "Hedy" Carlson

## Stephen Tobolowsky as Mitch Myerson

**Stephen Tobolowsky**, a prolific character actor famous for roles like Ned Ryerson in *Groundhog Day*, plays **Mitch Myerson**, the building's superintendent. Mitch is a slightly comedic, nosy figure who provides some welcome lightness in an otherwise tense film. He is the one who informs Allie about Hedy's history, delivering crucial exposition. Tobolowsky's performance keeps the character memorable without tipping into caricature. His presence answers another dimension of "**Who starred in**

**Single White Female?**"—the rich supporting cast that fills out the world.

## Michele Farr and Others

**Michele Farr** plays the brief but important role of **the real Hedra Carlson**, the twin who died. She appears only in a photograph, but her existence is the key to Hedy's psychosis. Additionally, **Jessica Lundy** appears as a friend of Allie, **Tony Genaro** appears as a police detective, and **Tom Riis Farrell** plays the manager of the hotel where key scenes unfold.
