PREPARING YOUR CHARACTER FOR THE UNDERDARK

Venturing into the Underdark requires more than just a sharp sword and a brave heart. It demands meticulous preparation. A party that enters the darkness unprepared is a party that will not return. This section of the Underdark Adventure Guide will cover the essential gear, spells, and skills needed to tip the odds in your favor.

Essential Gear and Equipment

- **Blunt Weapons:** Not every foe has flesh and blood. Skeletons, constructs, and crystalline entities are common. A warhammer, mace, or even a heavy club can be a lifesaver when your swords are ineffective.
- **Maps and Tools:** Chalk, charcoal, parchment, and a compass. Mark your path. Get lost, and you will die lost. A **Quaal's Feather Token (Anchor)** or similar magic item can create an emergency shelter.

Spells and Abilities to Prioritize

A wizard's or cleric's spell selection can make or break an Underdark expedition. Some spells become exponentially more valuable in this environment.

- **Darkvision:** While many races have it, it is limited. Consider spells like **Darkvision** for party members without it, or **See Invisibility** to spot lurking threats.
- **Move Earth and Passwall:** The terrain is your greatest enemy and ally. These spells allow you to reshape the battlefield or bypass obstacles entirely.
- **Water Breathing:** Underground rivers and lakes are often

the only navigable routes. This spell is non-negotiable for any serious expedition.

- **Teleportation Circle and Word of Recall:** Always have an escape plan. These spells can save the party from an unwinnable encounter.
- **Detect Poison and Disease:** You will eat fungus, drink from underground streams, and be bitten by strange creatures. This spell is preventative medicine.

NAVIGATING THE DANGERS: FLORA, FAUNA, AND FOES

The Underdark is teeming with life, but most of it is hostile to surface dwellers. A good Underdark Adventure Guide categorizes these threats so you know what you are up against. The ecosystem is based on chemosynthesis rather than photosynthesis, which leads to bizarre and terrifying adaptations.

Notable Monsters and Denizens

The Silent City of the Mind Flayers

A colony of illithids. These cities are unsettlingly quiet, filled with thralls performing their duties in eerie silence. The architecture is alien, built with a non-Euclidean geometry that can disorient visitors. The goal here is often infiltration—to rescue captives, steal a psionic artifact, or disrupt the colony's breeding program. Combat here means facing psychic assault, not just physical attacks.

The Fungal Forest of Neverlight Grove (Archetype)

A vibrant and bioluminescent ecosystem. Towering mushrooms the size of trees, glowing lichen, and sentient fungus creatures like Myconids call this place home. The air is thick with spores. This area is often less hostile than the cities, but it is filled with natural hazards and territorial creatures. The Myconids may be peaceful, but they are fiercely protective of their groves and can be manipulated by darker forces.

The Abyssal Trench

A massive chasm that descends into the Lowerdark. It is home to aboleths, kraken-like entities, and other primordial horrors. The trench is a place of madness and water. Adventures here require specialized diving gear and powerful water magic. The rewards, however, are ancient lore and primordial treasures sealed away for eons.

CREATING ENGAGING ADVENTURES IN THE UNDERDARK

An adventure in the dark is different from a surface adventure. The core pillars of exploration, social interaction, and combat are

all twisted by the environment. Here are some adventure hooks and story structures to inspire your next campaign.

Adventure Hooks

1. **The Lost Expedition:** A famous explorer has vanished into a known entrance. The party must retrieve their research notes and rescue them (or recover their body).
2. **The Slave Uprising:** A drow house is losing control of its slaves. The party is hired to help the slaves escape, or to help the drow put down the rebellion for a hefty fee.
3. **The Fungal Plague:** A strange, spore-based disease is spreading from the Underdark to the surface. The party must find the source in a fungal forest and destroy it.
4. **The Artifact of Darkness:** A powerful magical item, such as a **Ring of Spell Turning** or a **Staff of the Magi**, has been discovered in a ruined city below the mountains. Multiple factions seek it.
5. **The Rivalry:** Two drow houses are at war. The party is hired by a third party to tip the scales by assassinating a key leader or stealing a valuable asset.

Designing Encounters for

the Underdark

Combat in the Underdark is unique. The environment should always be a factor. Use **choke points**, **low visibility**, and **verticality**. A simple goblin ambush becomes terrifying when it happens on a narrow ledge over a 100-foot drop. Introduce environmental hazards like collapsing floors or toxic gas vents. Remember that **sound travels strangely** in caves. A noise can alert enemies from a great distance. Stealth is not just an option; it is often a survival strategy. Social encounters are equally important. The Underdark is a place of alliances and betrayals. A party might need to negotiate with a duergar merchant, gain the trust of a myconid sovereign, or make a desperate deal with a mind flayer to survive.

SURVIVAL TIPS FOR THE UNDERDARK EXPLORER
